# The Liturgy of the Word

#### The Word of God

A **Hymn** may be sung.

The people standing, the Officiant says

Blessed be God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

People And blessed be his kingdom, now and for ever.

Amen.

In place of the above, from Easter Day through the Day of Pentecost

Celebrant Alleluia. Christ is risen.

People The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia.

In Lent and on other penitential occasions

Celebrant Bless the Lord who forgives all our sins;

People His mercy endures for ever.

The Congregation says:

Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

### The Gloria is said or sung (except during Lent)

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth.

Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory.

Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen. During Lent the following is used Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy. Lord, have mercy. The Collect of the Day The Officiant says to the people The Lord be with you. And also with you. People Celebrant Let us pray. The Lessons The people sit. All stand. The Officiant says to the people

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People And also with you.

### **Birthday and Anniversary Blessings**

For a Birthday

O God, our times are in your hand: Look with favor, we pray, on your servant *N*. as (s)*he* begins another year. Grant that (s)*he* may grow in wisdom and grace, and strengthen *his/her* trust in your goodness all the days of *his* life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

#### For Wedding Anniversaries

O God, you have so consecrated the covenant of marriage that in it is represented the spiritual unity between Christ and his Church: We pray for your blessing to be upon these your servants, that they may continue to so love, honor, and cherish each other in faithfulness and patience, in wisdom and true godliness, that their home may be a haven of blessing and peace, and joy; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen*.
